#### What Does the HPS Foundation Fund?

The Foundation supports programs at all grade levels both in academics and technology. In the last Fiscal Year (July 1-June 30), program grants totaled \$65,000 with an additional \$40,000 in scholarships for graduating seniors. The examples below showcase three of the programs the Foundation supported last year.

#### **Highlights**

#### Slime Week

In recognition of Chemistry Month (October), students in Grades 2-5 explored chemical reaction by making slime. Second and third graders learned about the properties of ingredients and how they change when combined. The fourth grade studied luminescense (chemical reactions that cause glowing) and phosphorescence (substances that absorb light to glow) while making phosphorescent slime. Fifth grade students, meanwhile, researched the perfect slime recipe from thermochromatic (color-changing with temperature) to edible!





#### Coding

Second grade students practiced their coding skills using VEX 123 Robots. They are building on skills they started developing in kindergarten where they learned to code with button pushes. In first grade, coding progressed to coding cards and a card reader. Currently, students are coding more advanced commands with their ChromeBooks. The coding discipline develops excellent problem-solving skills.

#### **VEX Robotics Club**

An extension of the Robotics and Coding curricula, the VEX Robotics Club held a competition for Middle School and Elementary students in November. Working as teams, students design, build, code, and drive robots. The objective is to move blocks of varying sizes in the the score zone.

The club held three meets on consecutive Saturdays. After each competition, the team evaluated their robots' performance and made improvements in preparation for the next meet.



The competition provides real-life experience in problem solving. More importantly, though, it's a lot of fun!

#### Scholarships 2023

### **Scholarship Opportunity**

The Hancock Public Schools Foundation believes in the value of skilled trades. Scholarships are available for students planning further education, whether it be trade school or an apprenticeship. Career fairs provide a way to raise awareness of the plentiful opportunities for skilled trades workers.

In September of this year, 42 Hancock Central High School students had the opportunity to do some welding, operate spider cranes, and learn some plumbing basics at the Upper Peninsula Construction Council UPCC) trade careers fair.

The UPCC includes ten trade associations that want to attract students interested in learning about potential careers. The day-long event offered a variety of hands-on activities and information about apprenticeships and compensation.

"I was very impressed with the variety of hands-on activities that students were offered," said Guidance Counselor Michele Serafin. "The fair also offered them the unique opportunity to speak with a variety of skilled trades professionals."

Serafin also cited the popularity of the virtual reality construction vehicle driving simulator, and the small projects students made and were able to take home.

"Overall, I think students recognized that there are some wonderful opportunities out there for rewarding careers," Serafin concluded.
