Principal's Blurb

As Trimester 1 wraps up this week with exams, we are able to look back at the trimester with a great deal of success. On Monday, November 13 we had our Dawg Day to celebrate the positive choices students made throughout the trimester. We were able to recognize 90% of our students for good attendance (not missing more than 5 days of school in one trimester) and 6 students who had perfect attendance!

Dawg Day is a "surprise" day within one week, so although students are given over a week notice that it is coming up, they don't know the exact day. In order to be eligible for the activities, students must be passing all their classes, have no missing work, and have 3 or fewer referrals. This year, 82% of the students were able to enjoy the entire activity time because they met all the requirements. Most kids who didn't had some missing assignments, and as they finished up their missing work they were able to join in, which almost all did. This should bode well for all students as they head into their exams this week, as they should be properly prepared with just a little additional studying.
